Originator



- Prior to the initiation of the first credit or debit Entry to a Receiver's account with an RDFI. an Originator may originate a Prenotification Entry. An Originator that has originated a Prenotification may originate live Entries to a Receiver's account as soon as the third Banking Day following the Settlement Date of the Prenotification.
- 3a)The Originator must not originate such Entries.
- 4a) The Originator must not initiate such Entries unless the requested changes have been made.





- **ODFI** transmits the Prenotification Entry in compliance with the Rules set forth for the Originator as outlined in the NACHA Operating Rules.
- If the ODFI receives a Return Entry within the required timeframe indicating the RDFI will not accept the Entries...
- If the ODFI receives a Notification of Change within the required timeframe indicating the RDFI requires requested changes to be made prior to the initiation of such entries...

- RDFI must verify that the account number contained in the Prenotification is for a valid account. If the Prenotification does not contain a valid account number, or is otherwise erroneous or unprocessable, then the RDFI must transmit either:
 - A Return Entry OR
 - A Notification of Change
- (2a) An RDFI transmitting a Return Entry, the Entry must be made available to the ODFI no later than opening of business on the second Banking Day following Settlement Date of the original Entry.
- (2b) An RDFI may transmit a Notification of Change Entry (NOC also known as COR) within two Banking Days of the Settlement Date of the Entry to which the NOC pertains.
